It's easy to tithe and give your offerings online!

Your tithes, offerings, and donations to College Street Baptist can now be made online. Tithing and donating have never been easier. It's quick, easy and secure and you can use debit or credit or check cards, or checking account. Just go to our website at www.collegestreetbaptist.org for further information and instructions.

Online giving is not replacing any of the traditional ways we already give, but is an additional option to those who prefer to make their donations by computer, cell phone or other mobile devices. College Street is using a church donation system provided by the Easy Tithe corporation. *EasyTithe* is church specific and is currently used by hundreds of churches across the nation.

You can make a regularly scheduled contribution or you can specify recurring donations. You can specify whether the contribution should go to the general budget or to designated categories. A credit card (MasterCard, Visa, or Discover) or a debit card can be used as well as a regular checking account. The process is secure and confidential and you will have continual access to your giving records.

Golden Fellowship News....



College Street's Assistive Hearing System Now Available at the Welcome Desk


Our system will provide help for those with or without hearing aids. Although newer hearing aids are significantly improved, they cannot completely restore normal hearing. This is especially true in a reverberant sanctuary where clearly understanding all the various voices during church services may be difficult.

At the sound board, an FM transmitter broadcasts a radio signal containing all audio received by the sanctuary's microphones. At the welcome desk we have small FM receivers available for check-out. Also, there are earphones, headphones, and inductive T-coil loops — any of which can work with these receivers. These provide improved speech understanding because the listener receives a clear signal with no background noise. The sound frequencies are filtered and any "outlying" high/low-volumes are compressed to provide especially "crisp" voice quality. The system covers the entire sanctuary (and more), provides hands-free listening while moving around, and is hearing-aid compatible.

For those not wearing hearing aids, you will probably prefer to use your own earbuds. The welcome desk has available headphones and "single-side" earphones – and we can also give you an inexpensive set of earbuds to keep – but we recommend you purchase a higher quality, personal, earbud set at a local or online store.



For those with hearing aids, the T-coil (telecoil or T-loop) is recommended – assuming your hearing aid works with these inductive loops. (Those hearing aids for more severe hearing loss will probably have the T-coil. The tiniest in-ear hearing aids may not, or the T-coil setting may not have been programed or activated. Check with your audiologist.) If your hearing aid does not work with the T-coil, you can use an over-the-ear single-side-earphone, or you can use a headphone set.



Using the Neckloop

- 1. Place the neckloop over your head and around your neck as in the picture.
- 2. Slide the cord lock upwards to a comfortable position. This helps keep the neckloop in optimal position for coupling with your hearing aid.
- 3. Plug the neckloop into the earphone jack on the Williams Sound unit. Turn the unit on and set the volume control to "3," or about half of full volume.
- Turn the switch on your hearing aid to the "T" position and adjust the volume for comfortable listening.
- 5. If the sound is weak, increase the volume on the Williams Sound unit, then on your hearing aid.
